Directions to the centre of Prague (Můstek metro station)

From Ruzyně Airport

* Public transport

Take bus No. 119 (the bus stop is situated across the road from the Arrivals hall – follow the

signs) and go to Dejvická bus stop (terminal) outside the Dejvická metro station. Take the green

(A) metro line to Můstek metro station (4 stops).

The bus from the airport runs every 15–20 minutes. The whole journey takes about 40 minutes.

Basic fare: 26 CZK / Ticket purchased from driver: 30 CZK.

The Airport Express bus (AE) also leaves from the arrival hall and ends at the Dejvická metro

station as well. The journey takes about 18 min. and costs 30 CZK.

* Taxi

The AAA Taxi stand is immediately outside the arrival hall. The journey from the airport to the

centre of Prague should not exceed 550-600 CZK.

From the Main Train Station (Hlavní nádraží)

* Metro

Take the red (C) metro line in the direction of Háje terminal. Go to Museum metro station (1

stop) and change for the green (A) line. Go to Můstek metro station (direction of Dejvická, 1

stop).

The whole journey takes about 15 minutes.

Basic fare: 26 CZK.

From the Holešovice Train Station

* Metro

Take on the red (C) metro line in the direction of Háje terminal. Go to Museum metro station (4

stops) and change for the green (A) line. Go to Můstek metro station (direction of Dejvická, 1

stop).

The whole journey takes about 20 minutes. Basic fare: 26 CZK.

Directions to the workshop venue

The workshop will take place in the main building of the Faculty of Arts, Charles University in Prague, on Námeští Jana Palacha 2 (see plan at the end of this document – the Rudolfinum is located on the same square). The nearest metro station is **Staroměstská** on the green or A-line (take the exit marked "Námeští Jana Palacha - Rudolfinum" from the entrance hall (photo 1) and you are at the south side of the building (photo 2). The entrance to the building is on the west side, from the square (photo 3). Enter through the main door on Námeští Jana Palacha and proceed up the staircase to the first floor. The workshop will take place in room no. 104, slightly to the right from the staircase.

General Visitor Information

Transport in Prague

Public Transport

Travelling by city transport is only possible with a valid ticket, which has to be obtained before boarding the vehicle or entering the metro system. The ticket is valid only if marked in the validation appliance. Tickets can be bought at most metro stations (look for the yellow slot machines) or in *Dopravni Podnik* Information Centres, at hotels, news stands, tobacconists, travel bureaus, department stores, etc.

Transfer ticket – 26 CZK. Tickets for three fare zones can be used 75 minutes from validation. On working days from 8.00 p.m. to 5.00 a.m. and on Saturdays and Sundays (round the clock) such tickets can be used 90 minutes from the moment of validation.

Non-transfer ticket – 18 CZK. Tickets apply to trams and buses for 20 minutes allowing no change. On the metro such tickets are valid for the distance of 5 stations from the station of validation (not including the station of validation) allowing to change between the lines

A, B, C, but no longer than 30 minutes. These tickets do not apply to night routes and the funicular railway.

Luggage – 13 CZK (if the dimensions exceed 25x45x70 cm).

24-hour ticket – 100 CZK

3-day ticket – 330 CZK

5-day ticket – 500 CZK

The metro system operates every day between 5 a.m. and midnight.

Most trams and buses operate every day between 4.30 a.m. and midnight. The frequency of public transport during the day depends on the time of the day.

The period between midnight and 4.30 a.m. is covered by the operation of night trams and buses. The frequency of trams and buses at night is 30–60 minutes.
